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



Eric Berken Founder of Camerata di Magdalena

Eric Berken began studying the violin at the age of five; his primary teachers being Wei Shu Co, Liane Bliss, Gary Kosloski, and Paul Mackerra. He holds a bachelor's degree in violin performance and chemistry from Baldwin Wallace University as well as a master's degree in orchestral conducting from Bowling Green State University where he studied conducting under Emily Freeman Brown. Mr. Berken has also studied conducting under Dwight Oltman, Kirk Trevor, Donald Portnoy, and Leonard Bernstein.

Mr. Berken has been a private violin and viola teacher for over 40 years with many of his students going into professional music careers and participating in major international festivals and competitions. He is cofounder and past director of the Contemporary Youth Orchestra in Cleveland, Ohio, Conductor Laureate of the Northern Ohio Youth Orchestra Philharmonia in Oberlin, Ohio, and former director of the Heights Chamber Orchestra of Cleveland Heights, Ohio. Mr. Berken is also a composer having written numerous chamber works for all instruments and specializing recently in works for string ensemble.

Today he is the founder and director of Camerata di Magdalena which is a small conductor-less group of young musicians (ages 9 through 18). He created the group in order to give his students an ensemble experience, primarily focused on the practice and performance of music from the Baroque Era (1600-1750). Camerata di Magdalena proudly partners with The Holy Grill of St. Nicholas, a program that provides meals for the homeless of

Broward County.

Sylvia Aycock

GCSF Artistic Director

Sylvia Rose Aycock is a music educator who believes that young people deserve to be heard and feel empowered to share their stories and perspectives.

She joined GCSF's artistic staff in 2017, and is proud to bring together ensembles as diverse as the vibrant South Florida community she calls home. Under her leadership, the choir has performed with the Lynn Philharmonia, the Master Chorale of South Florida, the alt indie rock band KIDS, and on WLRN's Folk & Acoustic Music radio program.

Sylvia earned her bachelor's degree in music education from Florida State University where she was awarded several grants to conduct research on community music education in Brazil, and completed her honors thesis on the topic. Applying what she learned in her research, Sylvia started a choir at the PACE Center for Girls in Tallahassee, FL. Previously, Sylvia taught middle school and high school chorus in Orlando and Boca Raton, where her students regularly received high ratings at district and state assessments and travelled nationally.

She continues to sing locally with the choir of All Saints
Episcopal Church and with the Festival Singers of Florida under
the direction of Dr. Kevin Fenton. She is an active member of the
American Choral Directors Association and Chorus America.

Amanda Goldberg **GCSF Assistant Director**

Amanda Goldberg is a music educator passionate about using singing to develop the whole person. She holds bachelor's degree in music education from St. Olaf College, where she studied voice and organ. Amanda has directed children's choirs at St. John's Lutheran Church, All Saints Episcopal Church, and First United Church of Christ. She has worked previously as a counselor at Interlochen Arts Camp and assisted in directing the Northfield Youth Choirs' Anima ensemble.

Amanda joined the Girl Choir of South Florida as a chorister in 2010. As a member she served as Music Librarian and earned the titles of Figlia di Coro and Maestra di Coro, working regularly as a volunteer with multiple ensembles. Since graduating, she has continued to serve GCSF in many capacities; including acting as assistant conductor of a summer tour, Vice President of the Board of Trustees, and percussionist extraordinaire. She is delighted to now return to the Girl Choir as an Assistant Director.

Amanda is the choral director at Wellington Landings Middle School in Wellington, FL, and is a Staff Singer at the Episcopal Church of Bethesda-by-the-Sea in Palm Beach, FL. She presently holds a Level 1 CME Choral Teacher Certification and is an active member of the National Association for Music Education, the Florida Vocal Association, and the American Choral Directors Association. She is honored to be the recipient of Palm Beach County's 2022 Central Region Beginning Teacher of the Year.

Carolyn Morgan

GCSF Accompanist

Pianist Carolyn S. Morgan received her Master of Music degree from Peabody Conservatory and has held professorships at New Mexico Highlands University, Wells College in New York, and Florida International University.

After winning first place in the North Carolina Symphony auditions, she toured with the orchestra, performing Prokofiev's Piano Concerto No. 1. For their Carnegie Recital Hall debut, Morgan and duo partner, pianist Douglas Riva, performed works by American composers—the same program they performed on their U.S. State Department-sponsored tour of Spain. The duo subsequently recorded the works for Musical Heritage Society.

Ms. Morgan has performed in many South Florida chamber ensembles and was featured piano soloist with orchestra and chorus in Beethoven's Choral Fantasy. In addition to accompanying The Girl Choir of South Florida's ensembles, Carolyn is accompanist for the Broward Women's Chorale, organist for First Church of Christ, Scientist, and maintains a private teaching studio in Ft. Lauderdale.

Note from the composer, Moira Smiley: As a fifteen year old steeped in the beautiful, often harsh texts of Shape Note singing and all the big questions beginning to happen in me, I wrote out these verses in response to thinking about Charles Wesley's verse "And am I born to die, to lay this body down? And must my trembling spirit fly into a world unknown?" Four years later, I found them in an old diary, and wrote this fuguing tune to them in the house of the Lewis family in Bethesda, MD. 
